WELCOME TO DOWNTOWN

Downtown Florence is excited to welcome you to this historic and thriving district of Florence, South Carolina! With over 70+ local businesses within walking distance of your front door, you won't have to go far to experience some of the best shopping, dining, and entertainment that Florence has to offer.

Florence, South Carolina began as a railroad terminal at the junction of three rail lines and got its official start after one of the rail lines purchased 5 acres of property, including what is now Downtown Florence, in 1853. The county of Florence was created in 1888 and two years later, the City of Florence was chartered. Downtown saw a decline in the 1960's with the rise of shopping malls and many felt that it was too far gone to be saved. In 2011, a five-year plan was adopted to revitalize Downtown and since then, over \$300 million in public and private investments has been used to once again make Downtown Florence a bold and vibrant place.

With new businesses inhabiting buildings dating back to the early 1900's, Downtown Florence captures not only the history of the city, but its future as well. We hope you use this guide to discover the many local businesses and amenities here that make Downtown Florence, and the City of Florence, such a wonderful place to live.



DOWNTOWN PARKING

Downtown Florence currently has 2,500 free parking spaces available for Downtown residents and visitors. There is no charge to park in these spaces, but there are certain on-street parking options that are under a two-hour parking limit. To avoid getting a ticket, we suggest you or your guests utilize the on-street parking options for any quick trips and then utilize the surface and garage parking for longer visits.

DOWNTOWN LODGING & TRANSPORTATION

Lodging

Guests in Downtown Florence can currently choose between two conveniently-located hotels in Downtown for their short-term or long-term lodging needs.

Hotel Florence

Hotel Florence is a Tapestry Collection by Hilton hotel located at 126 West Evans Street. The hotel offers a total of 56 rooms plus a grand penthouse suite. It also houses the popular local restaurant and bar, Victors, on its first floor. Victors' indoor and outdoor spaces are available for events or meetings.

Hyatt Place Florence/Downtown

The Hyatt Place in Downtown Florence is located at 100 East Evans Street and offers a total of 103 rooms. The hotel is pet-friendly and also offers an on-site restaurant and bar and outdoor pool. Small to medium size meeting rooms are available for booking and guests can enjoy the 2nd floor outdoor terrace that overlooks Downtown.

Transportation

Thanks to funding from several local and federal organizations and businesses, the Pee Dee Regional Transportation Authority is able to offer a free shuttle service for residents and visitors for stops in Downtown Florence. There are also shuttles out to other popular Florence destinations for a base fare of \$1.50 per ride. Discount passes are available.

PDRTA's Free Downtown Shuttle

The free PDRTA Downtown Florence Shuttle runs from Monday to Friday from 9:00am to 5:00pm. Shuttle operation occurs every 30 minutes between 9:00am to 11:00am, every 15 minutes between 11:00am to 3:00pm, and back to every 30 minutes between 3:00pm to 5:00pm. The shuttle goes North to Darlington Street, West to Warley Street, South to National Cemetery Road, and East to William H. Johnson Street.



DOWNTOWN EVENTS

Downtown Florence is home to many award-winning street festivals, outdoor concerts, family events, and more. The FDDC currently produces six signature events during the ten-month event season including Pee Dee favorites such as the SC Pecan Music & Food Festival and Florence After Five. The event season kicks off in February and runs until December. A full event schedule can be found online at florencedowntown.com/events.

Downtown's Signature Events

SC Pecan Music & Food Festival

Held annually on the first Saturday in November, the SC Pecan Music & Food Festival is an all-day free event featuring live music, 250+ food and craft vendors, art demos, kids zone, amusement rides, and more. Takes place across Evans, Irby, Dargan, and Cheves Streets.

Oktoberfest



The Downtown Florence Oktoberfest is a free event held each year during the month of October. This event features authentic German food,

beer, and wine along with weenie dog races, beer stein races, barrel races, and more. Takes place on the 100 block of South Dargan Street.

<u>Tap Into Downtown</u>

TAP Reld in September, the Tap Into Downtown event TOWN annually transforms 12 CRAFT BREW CRAWL DOWNTOWN businesses into craft beer tasting rooms. A ticketed event, attendees receive a beer glass, a pretzel necklace, and a chance to sample 24 different craft brews.

Florence After Five

Held on the final Friday of the month, Florence After Five is a free concert series event that runs every month from May to September with a new band to enjoy for each event. Food and beverage vendors are available and the event takes place on the 100 block of South Dargan Street.

<u>Downtown Christmas Magic</u>

Held annually at the Dountoun beginning of December, MAGIC Downtown Christmas Magic features holiday lights and music, hot cocoa and marshmallow stations, live holiday entertainment, kids zone area, photos with Santa Claus, and more. Takes place on the 100 block of South Dargan Street.

Downtown Chocolate Crawl

The Chocolate Crawl is a ticketed annual event CHOCOLATE CRAWL held at the end of February that allows attendees to enjoy a variety of delicious chocolate samples as they visit nearly a dozen businesses throughout Downtown Florence.

DOWNTOWN ATTRACTIONS

Downtown Florence is home to several of Florence's premiere cultural institutions as well as other local facilities that provide entertainment and activities for families to individuals and patrons of all ages.

FMU Performing Arts Center



An approximately 68,000 square foot facility that provides state-of-the-art **PERFORMING** performance and educational venues. Its main elements include an

849-seat Mainstage, a 100-seat flexible Black Box Theatre, an Academic Wing for the Department of Fine Arts, and the BB&T Amphitheatre. The FMU PAC is located at 201 S. Dargan Street.

Florence County Museum

The Florence County Museum showcases over 140 works representing 20th-century Southern art, along with works by Florence native, William H. Johnson. Through a range of exhibitions, studios, lectures, and family programming, the FCM provides visitors of all ages with an educational experience. Located at 111 W. Cheves Street, the FCM is open daily Tuesday through Sunday.

City Center Farmers' Market



A year-round, outdoor market that features a wide variety of Carolina grown and Carolina made products. Items for sale

include meat, dairy, fruits, vegetables, sweets, wood & paper crafts, bread, body products, and so much more. Located at 200 Sanborn Street, the market is open every Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and seasonally on Tuesday nights from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m.

Florence Little Theatre

Originally started by a local group called the Community Players in 1923, the Florence Little Theatre currently offers a regular schedule of six Broadway-type shows, youth productions, workshops, and more. Located at 417 S. Dargan Street, the Theatre's show schedule typically runs from September to May with shows in the evenings and on weekends.

Drs. Bruce & Lee Foundation Library



Part of the Florence County Public Library system, the local Florence branch of the system offers books, reference services,

books on tape, audio tapes, printing and Internet access, and more for free use by all library patrons. Features a Children's Library, a reference department, and the South Carolina Room. Located at 509 S. Dargan Street, the Florence branch is open daily Monday through Sunday.

Andrew H. Griffin Plaza Splash Pad

Part of the Griffin Plaza space, the splash pad is an interactive water feature designed for children 12 & younger. Open from June to September during select daytime hours, the splash pad area includes eight spray jets and one column of water with various spray and LED lighting effects. The Plaza is located on S. Dargan Street to the left of Wholly Smokin'.

DOWNTOWN PUBLIC SPACES

Downtown residents can take a break from the hustle and bustle to enjoy the outdoors in several public spaces located throughout the Downtown area. Along with providing ease of access to streets and parking lots, these spaces also feature green spaces, public seating, and a selection of public artwork.

The Breezeway on Evans


Located at 160 West Evans, the Breezeway has ample bench seating and is a favorite photography spot for locals. The space provides easy walking access from the parking lot and parking garage on South Irby to the businesses on West Evans. It is also the home of the latest public art installation, a statue of Florence native, renowned artist William H. Johnson.

James Allen Plaza

Located at 109 South Dargan, the Plaza was designed as a community square and is used during many Downtown events. The Plaza can be rented for use for private and public events and bench seating is available. Iron, metal, and glass work created by local South Carolina artists is also featured throughout the plaza space.

Kress Alley

Located on North Dargan, this is a community public space that is adjacent to the Kress Building and the Lost Cajun restaurant (coming soon). The alleyway also provides easy walking access to North Dargan Street from the County Complex parking lots.
