I had never owned my own business before, never.

My daughter has really helped me through everything. Going to the market, trying to find what items to sell. You know, that was kind of difficult because we didn't really know what we should buy, how we were going to buy it, how much to buy; that was difficult, but we worked through all that.

We saw all kinds of different styles, and we didn't like all of them. We had to think not really about what we liked but about what everyone else would like; that's very important. We really had to come to grips with that. It's not about us; it's about all women.

My niece had a hair salon, and she had an empty room. My daughter said maybe we can use that for our boutique. So, we started out on Irby Street in a hair salon. Then, when she

was ready to close, we had to find a building; but we were online, and that saved us. We were still doing orders and stuff online when we found a building on Cashua.

On Cashua, we didn't get a lot of walk-ins. We got a lot of people traveling down that busy highway, but we didn't have a lot of stop-in people. People said, well, we just passed right on by because we were zooming by.

Then we came here, to downtown. You know, it's different down here because we get more walk-in traffic. I've met people from Canada and all different places who are staying at the hotels. I enjoy meeting new people, so I like it down here.

My thing is, if you are thinking about opening a business, go ahead and do it. My daughter told me that this is not a dress rehearsal. You're not coming back again. So, you do what you can do now.
